The largest study to date of African-American cancer survivors in the United States is underway. Launched in February 2017, the Detroit Research on Cancer Survivors (ROCS) study, which will include 5,560 cancer survivors, will support a broad research agenda looking at the major factors affecting cancer progression recurrence, mortality, and quality of life among African-American cancer survivors. The effort is funded by the National Cancer Institute (NCI), part of the National Institutes of Health with a \$9 million grant.

African Americans continue to experience disproportionately higher cancer incidence rates than other racial ethnic groups in the United States for most cancer types. They are also more likely to be diagnosed with more advanced stage disease and experience higher cancer mortality rates than other groups., The Detroit ROCS study will focus on lung, breast, prostate and colorectal cancers—the four most common types of cancer—each of which is marked by poorer survival rates among African-Americans than whites.

"This study is uniquely poised to investigate the major factors affecting African-American cancer survivors, said Douglas R. Lowy, M.D., acting director of NCI. "Efforts like this will hep us move toward bridging the gap of cancer disparities, ensuring that advances in cancer prevention, diagnosis, and treatment reach all Ameri
