Reducing the Risk of Cancer

When you take control of your health by making better choices, you not only reduce your risk of cancer but you also reduce the risk of heart disease, stroke and diabetes. Your efforts need not be drastic. Small steps can lead to big changes and a healthier body. The following are ways to reduce the risk of cancer:

- Avoid tobacco (smoking not only increases your risk of cancer, but second hand smoke can effect everyone near the smoke).
- Maintain a healthy weight (concentrate on diet and physical activity).
- Protect your skin (cover the skin and try to avoid direct sun. Skin protection includes sun glasses to protect the eyes and skin around the eyes),
- Know your family history and share information with your doctor.
- Get regular checkups and discuss any changes in your body with your doctor.



Breast Cancer Symptoms and Diagnosis

Breast cancer symptoms vary widely — from lumps to swelling to skin • changes — and many breast cancers have no obvious symptoms at all.

In some cases, a lump may be too small for you to feel or to cause any a lump in the underarm area unusual changes you can notice on your own. Often, an abnormal area These changes also can be signs of less serious conditions that are not turns up on a screening mammogram (X-ray of the breast), which leads to further testing.

In other cases, however, the first sign of breast cancer is a new lump or mass in the breast that you or your doctor can feel. A lump that is painless, hard, and has uneven edges is more likely to be cancer. But sometimes cancers can be tender, soft, and rounded.

It is important to have anything unusual checked by your doctor.

According to the American Cancer Society, any of the following unusual changes in the breast can be a symptom of breast cancer:

- swelling of all or part of the breast
- skin irritation or dimpling
- breast pain

- nipple pain or the nipple turning inward
- redness, scaliness, or thickening of the nipple or breast skin
- a nipple discharge other than breast milk

cancerous, such as an infection or a cyst. Again, it is important to get any breast changes checked out promptly by a doctor.

Breast self-exams should be part of your monthly health care routine, and you should visit your doctor if you experience breast changes. If you are over 40 or at a high risk of breast cancer, you should also have an annual mammogram and physical exam by a doctor. The earlier breast cancer is found and diagnosed, the better your chances of beating it.

The actual process of diagnosis can take weeks and involve many different kinds of tests. Waiting for results can feel like a lifetime. The uncertainty stinks. But once you understand your own unique "big picture," you can make better decisions. You and your doctors can formulate a treatment plan tailored just for you.
