This means to give God the best of whatever you have to offer in service and in deeds. 7) Praise. The highest expression of thankfulness is praise and the highest action of thankfulness is worship. When we praise God, we bless Him. Psalm 103 penned by David gives a picture on how we should praise God and a reason for thankfulness. As we give personal and corporate thanks to God, we are expressing that we are well pleased with Him and that we glorify, exalt and praise Him with devout affections and grateful hearts. This we demonstrate through our worship to Him and service to His people.

## Honoring our Veterans

World War I – known at the time as "The Great War" - officially ended when the Treaty of Versailles was signed on lune 28. 1919, in the Palace of Versailles outside the town of Versailles, France. However, fighting ceased seven months earlier when an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, between the Allied nations and Germany went into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. For that reason, November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of "the war to end all wars". In November 1919, President Wilson proclaimed November [], as the first commemoration of Armistice Day . An Act approved May 13, 1938, made the

legal holiday—a day to be dediand to be thereafter celebrated and known as "Armistice Day." set aside to honor veterans of World War I, but in 1954, after World War II had required the greatest mobilization of soldiers. sailors. Marines and airmen in the Nation's history; after American forces had fought aggression in Korea, the 83rd Congress, at the urging of the veterans service organizations, amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting in its place the word "Veterans".
