A Moment in Black History

Tribe of Issachar

Kawanzaa is a week-long celebration held in the United States and in other nations of the Western African dias pora in the Americas. The celebration honors African heritage in African-American culture, and is observed from December 26 to January I, culminating in a feast and gift-giving. It was created by Maulana Karenga and was first celebrated in 1966-67, as the first specifically African-American holiday. According to Karenga, the name Kwanzaa derives from the Swahili phrase matunda ya kwanza, meaning "first fruits of the harvest". A more conventional translation would simply be "first fruits". It was established as a means to help African Americans reconnect with their African cultural and historical heritage by uniting in meditation and study of African traditions. It celebrates the "seven principles of African Heritage" which Karenga said "is a communitarian African philosophy". Each of the seven days of Kwanzaa is dedicated to one of the following principles, as follows: Umoja (Unity): To strive for and to maintain unity in the family, community, nation, and race.

Kujichagulia (Self-Determination): To define and name ourselves, as well as to create and speak for ourselves. Ujima (Collective Work and Responsibility): To build and maintain our community together and make our brothers' and sisters' problems our problems and to solve them together.

Ujamaa (Cooperative Economics): To build and maintain our own stores, shops, and other businesses and to profit from them together.

Nia (Purpose): To make our collective vocation the building and developing of our community in order to restore our people to their traditional greatness.

Kuumba (Creativity): To do always as much as we can, in the way we can, in order to leave our community more beautiful and beneficial than we inherited it.

Imani (Faith): To believe with all our hearts in our people, our parents, our teachers, our leaders, and the righteousness and victory of our struggle.


